

Minutes of AGM 29/04/2017

Presidents Address: Georgina Drumm

You are very welcome to the 2017 AGM of Athletics Ireland. It is really heartening to see so many here today particularly on a bank holiday weekend, we appreciate your attendance and commitment to the association and the sport.

It is just over one year since my election as President of the Association and to be honest I am as pleased today as I was then when you the members elected me. I have travelled far and wide this last year enjoying your hospitality and celebrating along with you the achievements of your athletes. Now I know John must say to himself ever now and again where she is off to now. On a more serious note I feel that it is important that as President I support what you and your clubs are doing and for as long as I hold this office I will commit to continue to do so.

It has been a very busy year which included the Olympic Games in Rio, which I attended, we can be very proud of the performances of our athletes. While there were well publicised issues around the games, I will quote from the Olympic Review that was commissioned by Sport Ireland

"the Rio 2016 Olympic Games were successful for Athletics Ireland from both a performance and management perspective, with a true sense of team across athletes and staff".

It is always pleasing to receive such a review and we will strive to continue to maintain and improve on our high standards for all international teams as we go forward.

As you know I was elected on to the board of the Olympic Council of Ireland and again you have my commitment that I will serve the needs of the OCI and athletics ensuring the needs of the athletes are at the centre of everything we do. While the OCI has gone through a period of difficulty I have every confidence that with the new leadership and the renewed focus on governance that the future is bright.

We embarked on a journey in the last quarter of 2016 of writing a strategic plan for the 2017-2020 period, (copies available today) .We engaged with a number of stakeholders in the preparation of the plan to ensure that we had meaningful inputs at the beginning of the process and this has served us well.

I wish to extend my thanks to Caroline O Shea for her assistance and guidance in ensuring that we followed the appropriate process and to the CEO and the staff of AAI. The discussion took us in many directions with numerous suggestions and changes throughout the process which John incorporated and delivered. John will speak more about this later

We also had a very good meeting with representatives of the provincial councils and regions with lots of discussion on various aspect of the association which was indeed very enlightening, we do intend to continue with these meeting on a more regular base.

2016 was a great year for competition for Juvenile, Junior, Under 23, Seniors and Masters, again I would like to thank the various committees and their chairs along with the staff and all the wonderful volunteers for their outstanding contribution in ensuring that we ran our championships so well. Attendances at our senior championships needs to be improved and we will work hard to deliver this objective for the future.

The building of the new indoor track as part of the Sport Ireland Campus has been a huge boost for Athletics, we now also have a regional development officer working in the campus.



Athlone International Arena is also hugely important to us and we will continue to host a number of our National Championships in Athlone.

Nenagh is where it all started which served the athletic community so well over the years and I am pleased that there are plans to improve the facilities even further we look forward to the future development and with working with you.

The building of the Cross Country course in Abbotstown was another big milestone for our sport, the Irish Life health National Cross Country Championships held in November were a great success.

To our clubs and counties who also hosted our cross country championships we are indeed thankful for your continued support and your involvement in promoting cross country championships.

Another exciting development was the appointment of Paul McNamara as the Director of High Performance, he has already hit the ground running and we feel that Paul will be a great success in the role, I would like to welcome him on board in his new role and wish him well.

With the appointment of Paul there will be a renewed focus on Coaching as part of the high performance brief, we have many talented coaches and our plan over the next number of years is to assist these coaches through mentoring and assessing their needs to ensure that they can be the best that they can be.

We continue to make progress on adopting the Governance Code which is central in ensuring that we manage our organisation appropriately. We have a group of board members and staff with assistance from an outside body working on this to ensure that we are fully compliant by the end of 2018.

While we continue to increase our funding through our own resources we could not do what we do without the on-going assistance from Sport Ireland on Core Funding and High Performance Funding.

The CEO and I met with the Board of Sport Ireland recently and they are happy with how we are operating and have acknowledged all we have done on increasing funding through our own resources. We received close on €2million through Sport Ireland in 2016 we must ensure that this funding is sustained and indeed increased and to copper fasten this support we must continue to run our affairs professionally. We extend a sincere thank you to Sport Ireland and indeed to all our sponsors.

2016 NTO Process was a tremendous success with successful candidates receiving certification later in the day.

International Appointees are to be congratulated: John Cronin, Declan Curtin, Ronan O Hart, Pierce O Callaghan, Ray Flynn, Shaun Gallagher and Suzana Costin.

Additional events in 2016 which brought great cheer to Ireland, Robert Heffernan was presented with an Olympic Bronze Medal in Cork, first Olympic medal presented on Irish soil. Tremendous attendance from all sports, a very proud day.

Olive Loughnane World Gold Medal presented at European Track & Field Championships in Amsterdam presentation by Lord Sebastian Coe. Another presentation after the fact but acknowledged by all in attendance with great pride.

Now I think that is enough for any one day from me, we have a full agenda with the main purpose of the meeting to present the 2016 Accounts which George Maybury will do.


- What is the process for reviewing governance? Will the review be conducted by a body other than Carmichael? (Catherine Muckian)
 - Review process will be conducted by outside body. (Georgina Drumm)
 - Athletes traveling to European Youth Championship were required to make a financial contribution. No athlete should be required to pay when representing Ireland. (Nick Davis)
 - There was a budget of €50k for the event based on 16 athletes reaching the qualifying standard. 31 athletes achieved the standard, costing €90k. €20k of the shortfall was generated through AAI. The balance was contributed by Counties/Regions in support of their athletes. This was a good news story, no athlete was required to make a payment on their own behalf. The opportunity afforded to all qualifying athletes to travel was a very positive experience for the athlete's long term development. (George Maybury, John Foley, Bríd Golden)

Athletics Ireland Club Safety Policy

The Safety Statement should be used as a guide /reference only for your club. There is an onus on clubs to undertake Hazard identification and risk assessment applicable to the situation/club etc. It should undertake risk assessments. There could be elements of liability if not undertaken by a safety practitioner or those who have the experience. Clubs should recognise when to call in experience on the or other issues.

Coaching & Development Update - Brid Golden, Chair of High Performance

Focus areas, open floor discussion:

- Is it appropriate to bring the Coaching/Development & High Performance Committees together?
- How do we manage club and development coaching?

Comments from the floor

- General approval for further debate on uniting the committees
- It is important to remain focused on development to ensure that an amalgamated committee represents all stakeholders.
- Club coaches should be included in athlete development when their athlete progresses to HP level.
- > Technical event coaches are improving at club level.
- Kerry development squads, funded through a registration levy are excellent.
- Dublin Graded Meetings include coaching workshops in specific events.
- RDO's work needs to be reviewed, they are overwhelmed.
- We need more interaction with post primary schools with regard to coaching.
- Are there enough qualified coaches to take on the extra work?
- We need to find ways to retain coaches.
- If the committees merge we must ensure that Coaching & Development receive adequate focus.
- > Juvenile Competition should be age appropriate, early specialisation is leading to burnout. Do we need to broaden the scope to look at juvenile athletics in its totality?
- There is a lack of competition opportunities for field event athletes.
- We need a broad base of athletes in order to find athletes with inherent ability.
- We will need to amend our Memo's and Art's to reflect any proposed changes in the committee structure.
- Coaching sits in both Development and High Performance areas.
- Some divide is necessary between Development/Coaching/High Performance.

Summary – Bríd Golden

Development is our core work and deserves continued investment. Athletes choose their own paths, however we need to create the pathways.
