MINUTES OF AGM 2020



Minutes of the AGM (virtual) held in the AAI Northwood offices via Zoom at 7pm on Wednesday the 15th of July 2020.

1. Georgina Drumm welcomed everyone and read the agenda for the evening explaining the exceptional nature of the AGM.

The roll was conducted and verified with Gerry Dunne (legal) was on hand to oversee the integrity of the process.

The roll call recorded 137 delegates present including 15 members of the board.

2. Motion: Special Board Resolution

THAT: Article 51 of the Athletic Association of Ireland Constitution to include an additional clause;

"In the event of any extraordinary event that the government of the day has declared a national emergency, the Board has the authority to postpone an AGM/EGM and/or Congress with immediate effect from the original date to be rescheduled for the earliest practicable time subject to the requirements of Company Law. All parties who are entitled to notice must receive at least 30 days' notice of the new date as an exception to Article 95 and all required documentation must be distributed with the notification if not already sent. No additions or changes can be made to already submitted motions or nominations unless provided for elsewhere in these Articles."

This Motion would have to be passed by way of Special Resolution requiring at least 75% support, noting Article 80 where "the Articles may be amended only by a Special Resolution duly passed at a General Meeting of which at least 21 days' notice has been given to those members entitled to receive notice.

The motion was proposed by Georgina Drumm and seconded by John Cronin.

The vote was conducted as a poll on zoom. The motion carried with 123 votes in favour and 1 against.

Immediately following the vote result the board convened in a virtual break out room to consider the special resolution for 5 minutes.

On return to the main forum the president announced a provisional date for the AAI Congress of Saturday October 3rd, 2020 in Ballybofey, Co Donegal depending on Government pandemic advice.



3. Georgina Drumm opened the AGM and delivered the President's address.

Good Evening Everybody, I will start by thanking you for joining us here tonight for our Athletic Association of Ireland 2020 AGM albeit remotely, a first for Irish Athletics.

I wish to welcome our Life Vice Presidents Padraig Griffin, Michael Heery, Nick Davis, Liam Hennessy, our Legal Advisor to AAI Gerry Dunne and Joe Fitzgerald Mulcahy, O'Neill, Fitzgerald & Co, Accountants.

Complying with Health and Safety guidelines we have limited the board attendance in Head Office to Deputy President John Cronin, Chair of Finance and Risk George Maybury, Hamish Adams CEO, Darragh Brown Marketing I.T, our legal Advisor Gerry Dunne and myself. Joining us for the Accounts will be John Holian, Finance Director while Joe Fitzgerald will also join us on zoom link. Kieron Stout will record the minutes of the meeting remotely.

Little did we know in April 2019 at our last AGM that the World would be catapulted into unknown territory with the Covid 19 pandemic, like all countries Ireland did not escape the terrible tragedy which is still ongoing. We all had to embrace a new way of living and say farewell to friends and family in the most difficult of times. In our sport every day brought a new challenge, clubs had to close , training cease , no competition which is the reason we are all in the sport, but in all difficult times there is a light at the end of the tunnel and we are gradually returning to what we do best.


One of the challenges was how to manage the requirements of our Constitution and fulfil the legalities of the companies act. After much deliberation we have arrived here tonight, we held a meeting with the provinces and County Boards to inform you of this step, and now the vote has been recorded regarding the special resolution asking you to support separating the AGM from Congress under exceptional circumstances.

I am deeply and acutely conscious that I should not be speaking to you as President of Athletics Ireland at this time in normal circumstances, that we should have held Congress in April 2020 and that a new Board, President and Committee should be in-situ however events have overtaken the normal and we had to press on in these trying times.

We have had to make decisions which moved that time line for Congress even further out but I stress that decisions to make that change were made by the board in full and certain knowledge that we were doing so for all the right reasons and that was for the safety of our members and families and the country as a whole.

Virtual meetings have become the normal, both competitions committees have kept in regular contact with the provinces to keep them updated and seeking their views on the possible way forward and in more recent times preparing for the truncated competition programme. Competition has been on hold for the longest time but to see a return to action is openly welcomed, regrettably not all units are in a position to kick start but hopefully in the not so distant future we will have a full programme. I understand the disappointment felt however there is a greater need for a cautious return on a scaled back nature which we expect will pay dividends in the end for our sport and all our members.

Virtual coaching continued, did I ever think in my time as President that I would be using those words, did I even understand what that impact would have on the younger members of our community. Just seeing their enthusiasm for the tasks presented and the need for them to continue exercising and keeping up with their plans laid out by their coaches was inspiring and an enormous





credit to their families and club structure that instilled in them a love of the sport and the need to keep active and therefor healthy. When the restrictions gradually eased our sport was on view to all with a constant presence of runners on the roads and bye ways.

High Performance continued liaising with the athletes, policing the ever-changing landscape of the International Calendar. Budgets needed to be reworked with ongoing communications with Sport Ireland, European Athletics, World Athletics and the Olympic Federation of Ireland. The International Programmes has been decimated, the athletes were devastated with the cancellation of all the competitions as their dreams and aspirations were put on hold. With a resilience and pragmatism that athletes have they dusted off and re focused on the future, which is still uncertain, but hope comes into its own when crisis looms. Many of the competitions have been rescheduled to 2021 some were cancelled but all going well there is an enormous year of competition for our elite athletes to look forward too.

AAI European Cross-Country Committee are continuing their preparations for December 13th in Dublin Fingal, the only European Championship still on the calendar, which is not without its challenges. Following the success of our teams in Lisbon 2019 we are all looking forward to hosting the event this year. Celebration the athlete's success from last year won't take the normal route as unfortunately we will not be holding the AAI Annual Luncheon this year due to all the very obvious reasons that has presented over the past months but we will be acknowledging their wonderful success, the format of which has yet to be decided.

Finance and Risk Committee have met regularly to keep updated with the daily briefings and changes made by the government which affected our budgets and strategies. Hard decisions needed to be made, the staff in Northwood have been affected by the Corona Virus Pandemic, some taking a cut in pay, others on Covid payments but I must say that they have been extremely supportive of decisions made, knowing that those decisions would affect them personally. Budget Planning for 2021 will take priority in the next quarter with the uncertainty of funding and the calendar still not fully finalised, it will prove to be a difficult task with some predictions close to shooting in the dark.

George Maybury Chair of Finance & Risk will bring us through the 2019 Accounts a little later on, and when we convene Congress George will give us an interim report on the financial position at that time when we hope to have a clearer picture of the road ahead.

My sincere thanks to CEO Hamish Adams who has driven the agenda successfully with the department and Sport Ireland for the return to training and ultimately competition on our behalf. All the Senior Management worked throughout this crisis some remotely with a small presence in the office to great effect, my gratitude to all the staff who worked from home in very challenging times. Hamish has prepared a more detailed review of the Association which he will deliver later in the evening

To all the members of the various committees who have carried on and continued with planning, I personally want to thank you all for your understanding, it must be said that all sports experienced the difficulties presented, but with excellent cooperation we got back up and running as soon as was practically possible.

Our Board have met monthly on zoom meetings with almost full attendance, which was very heartening, discussions were lively and informative. As always, I am thankful for their contributions and their professional approach to the meetings and any area that they were asked to research.





We have returned to Northwood after the fire, a beautiful and appealing new workspace where all the staff have been accommodated in a very good atmospheric place. Lots of light, new layout and a new décor, I extend an invitation to you to visit the office whenever you are in Dublin and more importantly when the restrictions are lifted, and social distancing can be observed.

I would like to acknowledge the New Minister for Sport Catherine Martin and Minister of State with responsibility for Sport Jack Chambers on their appointments and wish them success, we look forward to working with them into the future. We continue to have a very good working relationship with Sport Ireland and thank them for their continued invaluable support. Hamish and I have attended Provincial Council meetings which was a priority throughout the past year to keep you informed of the progress made since out last AGM. There were numerous functions and invitations received which I was pleased to accept and help celebrate your successes. Both of our Annual awards celebrations as ever were well attended with special recognition to all our extremely talented athletes who had great national and international results, details in CEO report. I have attended Congress and Conventions of European Athletic and World Athletics formally known as IAAF representing Athletics Ireland and I am currently a member of the Board Olympic Federation of Ireland. An extremely rewarding year of activities which I enjoyed enormously.

What we all missed the most during the time when our country was in lock down was not material things, but simply put PEOPLE - the daily chat, social interaction with friends and family, we can accept disappointment, but we must never lose sight of hope.

Please continue to be safe, take care and remember if plan A doesn't work out there are 25 more letters in the alphabet.
















At the end of the CEO's report, the CEO made special thanks to the Board, Staff and President and all members for their contribution to the sport of athletics.
